Our speaker will be Tim Weinger, an assistant professor in the <u>College of Engineering</u> at the <u>University of Notre Dame</u>, with appointments in the <u>Interdisciplinary Center for Network Science and Applications</u> (iCeNSA) and the <u>Department of Computer Science and Engineering</u>.

Tim joined the faculty in August 2013, after completing his Ph.D. in <u>Computer Science</u> at the <u>University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign</u>. He works in "network science", with a particular focus on multimodal/heterogeneous information networks. His research lies at the intersection of machine learning and databases and information retrieval. Tim's principal research interest is in large-scale multimodal (typed/heterogeneous) information networks, and more generally in data mining, databases, machine learning, statistics and network science. Due to the size of certain information networks and their corresponding databases, most of his work falls within big data paradigm, which requires an expanded use of new technology.

If you are still running on IBM i version 5.4, you need to strongly consider upgrading to V7R1!

As we discussed at the March 21, 2013 MRMUG meeting, support for V5R4 ended on September 30, 2013.

If you are still running on V5R4, you can purchase Service Extension for V5R4 for basic usage and problem rediscovery support. Software Maintenance is a REQUIRED prerequisite for Service Extension.

Service Extension for V5R4 ends September 30, 2016.

#### IBM i V7R2 is now available

IBM i OS Version 7 Release 2 was announced on April 28, 2014 and available on May 2, 2014.

Version 7 Release 1 was announced April 13, 2010 – that's over four years ago!

You should consider upgrading to Version 7, if you haven't already done so. Upgrading to Version 7 will help ensure that you will be able to take advantage of the newer processors and IO enhancements, performance, and security enhancements.
